On first seeing a photograph around 1840, the influential French painter Paul Delaroche proclaimed, "From today, painting is dead!" The story sounds far-fetched, but it captures the anxieties that surrounded the technology when it first emerged in the mid-19th century.

It may have been shockingly logical to proclaim painting's doom in the 1830s, when the invention of photography revolutionized the potential of visual art. But French painter Paul Delaroche's famous exclamation, "From today, painting is dead!" seems ironic now. Rather than kill fine-art painting, photo-realism only liberated it, freeing it from the fussy dominion of perspectival studies, tromp l'oeil showmanship and painfully slow portraiture.

Delaroche is often quoted as saying "from today, painting is dead". The observation was probably made in 1839, when Delaroche saw examples of the Daguerreotype, the first successful photographic process. See also.
