This results in the light falling on the subject at an angle, rather than straight on. The second thing to understand is that the off-camera flash needs to fire in sync with the camera shutter release.

If you do not have a light meter, but your flash can talk to the camera when it is off-camera (again check your manual for remote firing settings) you can use the TTL (Through the Lens) metering options for your flash. If you want the flash equal to the natural light, leave it set to "0" or slightly less like "-0.6".
