Universal design is closely aligned with the concepts of equity, diversity, accessibility and inclusivity.

Applying this to higher education takes us to a definition along the lines of – universal design for learning in higher education involves designing lectures, modules, courses and higher education institutions so that they can be accessed readily by the widest possible range of students. So what does this mean in practice?
